Press Statement Of the ERDF political bureau On the UNSC Sanction Resolution

Recently the Eritrean Revolutionary Democratic Front's (ERDF) political bureau studied the sanction set forth by the United Nations Security Council on the fascist Regime of Peoples for Democracy and Justice (PFDJ). The resolution was welcomed by the ERDF for it was due time that the United Nations intervened as the current and ongoing political strife in Eritrea and the region of East Africa, with respect to the Eritrean - Djibouti boarder conflict and the situation with Somalia, has augmented the level of unrest in East Africa. The sanction resolution is considered to be an example of an act of social justice, peace and stability against the crude and disparaging acts of the fascist regime of the PFDJ.

The ERDF finds that this sanction, although presented at the pinnacle of events and late none the less, aims to provide the region with security and stability from what has been years of hostilities. The people of Eritrea and the neighboring nations stand to procure from this sanction peace and accord. The only downfall with respect to the resolution is that it fails to take into consideration the plight of the Eritrean people. The inhumane manner by which the PFDJ treats the Eritrean people reflects the nature of the regime and the ideology by which they stand by. This evident in the way the PFDJ's acts of cruelty extend towards the neighboring countries in the East African region.

The PFDJ on countless occasions has violated the basic human rights of the people of Eritrea. The people are being detained against their will, forced to perform grueling acts of Labour, and there is no freedom of association, beliefs, and expression. These events have caused many Eritrean people to flee their country and seek asylum in neighboring African countries and other nations around the world. Under the governance of the PFDJ, Eritrea proves to be a country in distress.

The United Nations should be more solicitous towards the Eritrean peoples' predicament for they have paid the biggest price. The support and arbitration of the United Nations sets forth the beginning of a path towards a better Eritrea and as a result a better and peaceful East Africa. The governing body of Eritrea is in need of change and re-adherence to a true democratic state.

If we allow this fascist regime to remain in power, the people of Eritrea and East Africa will only continue to suffer. This democratic change can take place in favour of the Eritrean people if and only if the international community works hand in hand with the Eritrean people to actively place the regulations and mediums proposed by the United Nations Security Council by which social justice can prevail.
